She's the habit that will break you! *Nun of That*

Imagine if you will 'Dirty Harry' as a woman, now further that train of thought by making her a Nun with some anger management issues and you'll start to get a handle on the insanity that makes Director Richard Griffin's latest production, *Nun of That* more fun than a barrel full of horny clergy! Rarely do I come across a film that sits as well as this one did. The bottom line is Director Richard Griffin (*Feeding the Masses*, *Splatter Disco*, *Necroville*) is a good filmmaker and consistently delivers quality product on shoestring budgets. With *Nun of That* he has outdone himself and produced one of the most purely satisfying film excursions I have had recently.



Who doesn't enjoy riffing on religion, or more specifically the antiquated dogma associated with it. In Griffin's film Jesus is a rock star who drives a black Trans-Am (just like Burt Reynold's 'Bandit'), he sings, tells dirty jokes and makes all the Nun's horny! No other part of the human condition has a rod up its ass as much as religion, so it is wonderful when filmmakers such as Griffin pull that rod out and wave it around like a huge dildo! The message here is lighten the fuck up and get over the trappings that have obscured the wisdom, have fun in life and relax.



The story is that of 'Sister Kelly Wrath' (Sarah Nicklin). Sister has a bit of a temper problem and a vicious tongue to boot! She doesn't suffer fools well and won't put up with any of the bullshit going on around her. The opening sees her lay waste to a gleeful lesbian Nun's advance and kick the shit out of a pedophile priest. Transferred to a far more disciplined order, Sister is sent away to learn propriety and to get a grasp on her antisocial tendencies. After delivering a Charles Bronson-esque

Death Wish to a gang of would be rapists, Sister is herself killed by the radical members of the elite "Order of the Black Habit".

Arriving in Heaven she meets the man himself, Jesus (Michael Reed), who takes her aside and explains that he would really like it if she joined the "Order of the Black Habit" herself so that she may return to earth and exact revenge on all those who deserve it. Jesus doesn't give Sister a choice in the matter, her first assignment will involve eliminating the 'Mama Rizzo' (Rich Tretheway) syndicate of Providence. (These are the same goons responsible for the death of her mother and father years earlier). Before she can return however she must be trained in the ancient art of Nun-Fu! Her instructor none other than Gandhi himself, and let me tell you Gandhi doesn't fuck around! Putting Sister through her paces in his heavenly Nojo, Gandhi much like 'Pai Mei' in *Kill Bill Vol.2* trains Sister in the deadly arts. Finally donning the black, she returns for vengeance!



Once on earth Sister Wrath meets the other members of her crime fighting unit, 'Sister Pride' (Alexandra Cipolla) who likes the ladies... a lot. 'Sister Gluttony' (Ruth Sullivan) who likes everything... a lot. And 'Sister Lust' (Shanette Wilson) whose name probably explains what she's into. Together these four ladies leave a trail of bodies, libidos, and chips behind them that has to be seen to be believed!

There wasn't anything I didn't like about this film. The production value overall was pretty damn good, the performances were excellent, with Nicklin, Sullivan, Tretheway and Reed standing out and stealing a show that is filled with good bits! The musical number featuring Jesus had me howling out loud and the dialogue is filled with some of the most inventive twists I have seen in quite some time. Pack up your throwing stars of David, gather all your Jew-jitsu practicing buddies, throw back a few Tequila and Holy water shots and try not to stain your shorts because you are laughing so (God)damned hard! Don't forget to watch for the one and only Debbie Rochon as 'Mother Superior' and the potentate of poor taste Lloyd Kaufman as 'The Pope'.
